### **What does EWMFP stand for?**

Environmental Works and Measures Feasibility Program State-led Community Component.

The community was involved at a number of stages throughout the past 12 months including at inception, where expressions of interest were provided by the community and during the series of community workshops to prioritise and develop ideas, as well as communications providing feedback on the process.

### **How were these six community ideas selected?**

As described in the [Fact Sheet](#) "Stages of the Environmental Works and Measures Feasibility Program State-led Community Component", there were five stages involved in identifying and prioritising community ideas which ultimately led to six pre-feasibility assessment reports being completed and forwarded to the Australian Government. These ideas were shortlisted after a rigorous process which identified the community identified highest priority ideas for their potential to contribute to achieving the objectives of the Basin Plan.
