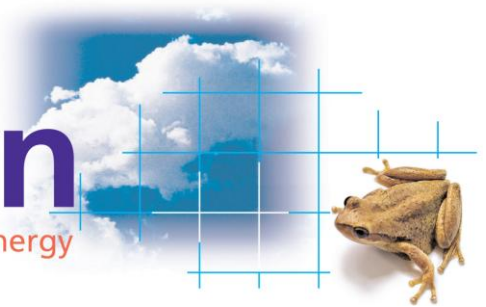

Should I apply for this grant?

Grant writing can be a lengthy task, so asking the question 'should I apply for this grant?' first can save you time. Just as the grant provider is assessing applications, applicants should also assess whether the grant is a good fit for their project. Below is a suggested rubric to fill in. The best grant match earns 4-5 points in every category.

Criteria	Points (1-5)	Comments
Is your (pre)school eligible?		
Does the grant provider want to fund your type of project (criteria)?		
Does your project align with the goals of the grant provider (guidelines)?		
Does the grant offer the necessary funds? Does it <u>not</u> fund parts of the project?		
Is the school required to provide funding and/or in kind support?		
Do you have the necessary information to easily fill in the application?		
Do you have support from key people to complete the project?		
Are the evaluation methods simple and compatible?		
Are you able to complete your project by the grant acquittal timeframe?		
Do you feel comfortable with the conditions of the grant? e.g. grant provider promotion.		
How will you maintain the project?
